- Exchange studies for PhD students are organized according to individual plans.
- It is not possible for exchange students to defend their BA/MA/PhD thesis at the host university.
- Incoming international staff members should apply for visits to the departmental coordinators of the respective faculty
 (http://www.lu.lv/eng/istudents/exchange/coordinators/) with copy sent to the International Relations department
 (ad@lu.lv) of the University of Latvia.
- Applicants with special needs will be contacted before the final approval of the acceptance. Final decision depends on extra services/ facilities available.

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 6 weeks.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than **5 weeks** after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

The agreement will become operative on the date of signature of both universities and shall remain in force for a period of **7 years**. In case of the termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be sent to the partner university. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
