# KARABUK UNIVERSITY INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS OFFICE ERASMUS+ LEARNING MOBILITY STUDENT SELECTION ANNOUNCEMENT FOR 2022/2023 ACADEMIC YEAR<sup>1</sup>

- In order to be able to participate in Erasmus+ Learning Mobility, students are required to provide primarily the following minimum requirements.
  - 1- The student has to be a full-time student enrolled in a higher education program in any of the cycles of formal education in the higher education institution (first [associate degree, bachelor], second [graduate] or third [doctorate- specialization in medicine] level.)
  - 2- The cumulative academic grade point average of the short, first, second and third cycle students must be at least 2.50 out of 4.00.
  - 3- For the learning mobility: at least 30 ECTS is required.
  - 4- If a student has benefited from the mobility before in the current study cycle, the total duration of the mobilities with the new mobility must not exceed 12 months.
- Applications will be held online between February 07<sup>th</sup>, 2022 (from 00.01) and February 21<sup>st</sup>, 2022 (till 23.59) from erasmus.karabuk.edu.tr with the User Name and Password.

The user names of the students who have already entered the system have been updated with TC ID number. To log into the system: (user name: TC ID number, password: OBS password).

The students who will enter the system for the first time are required to register to the system first by clicking "Register&Apply" and then will complete their applications by logging into the system. To log into the system:

### Minimum Language Score is;

for Western (English) Languages and Literature and Applied English Translation Departments 70, for Engineering Faculty 60, for Institutes 60,

for other Faculties and Vocational Schools 50 out of 100.

With this announcement, students will be selected primarily for the 2021-1-TR01-KA131-HED-000003000 project. However, the reserve student list that will be formed as a result of this announcement will be used when the 2022 project and other possible projects are announced, without the need for a separate application









For language score, B1 (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages / CEFR) \* language level was designated as the minimum language level. Students who will not have the language examination but want to declare another language document will be able to process according to the references on the link below.

The language scores to be accepted in Erasmus + Learning Mobility applications are as follows:

"Exchange Programs Foreign Language Exam" held by the School of Foreign Languages (YDYO)

School of Foreign Languages (YDYO) preparatory exemption exam scores (80 and above)

School of Foreign Languages (YDYO) preparation completion scores (80 and above)

School of Foreign Languages Erasmus + Course completion exam scores (according to minimum language scores of faculties and institution)

The scores of YDS, e-YDS, YÖKDİL and scores from the exams accepted as equivalent by ÖSYM

The scores of students who have proficiency from European languages other than English in the relevant exams accepted by official institutions.(according to minimum language scores of faculties and institution)

When applying, you need to choose which score type you want to use in the application and upload the documents to the system to prove that you have had the relevant exam scores (such as YDS, e-YDS, YÖKDİL and scores from the exams accepted as equivalent by ÖSYM). There is no need to upload any documents for the "Exchange Programmes Language Exam" held by the School of Foreign Languages (YDYO)

#### • Evaluation Criteria

The achievement score will be calculated as the academic grade point average (gpa) 50% + Language Exam Score 50%.

- Students who fulfill the minimum requirements will be able to waive financial support if they are in substitute list and will be able to participate in mobility according to our quotas, if they wish.
- Selected students who change their minds about attending Erasmus+ Learning Mobility











must submit a petition for waiver by March 21<sup>st</sup>, 2022. Otherwise, **10 points will be decreased** from overall score of their next applications.

- 10 points will be decreased from the overall score of the students <u>for each previous</u> <u>participation</u> of the Erasmus+ Learning and Traineeship Mobility projects in the same study cycle.
- 10 points will be added to the the overall score of the students with special needs on the condition that they submit their documents showing their status during the application period.
- 15 points will be added to the overall score of the students who are the children or wife of martyries and veterans on the condition that they submit their documents showing their status during application period.
- Within the scope of the Social Services Law No. 2828 and Child Protection Law No. 5395
   10 points will be added to to the overall score of the students who have been decided to be protected, cared or sheltered, on condition that they submit their documents showing their status during application period.
- 10 points will be decreased from the overall score of the students who have applied for Karabuk University Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility and Gazi Consortium Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility between 17<sup>th</sup> December 2021 31<sup>st</sup> December 2021 and selected as erasmus students (or subtitutes).
- Erasmus+ Learning Mobility is limited to a <u>minimum of 2 and a maximum of 12 months</u>. It is especially important for our students who have previously participated in the Erasmus + Learning or Traineeship Mobility to consider this period.
- At the next applications (for both learning and internship mobility), 10 points will be decreased from the overall score of the selected and nominated students who have completed all necessary documentation and procedures if they inform us about their withdrawal from the mobility in the date after which any other students can not be nominated instead of them due to the nomination deadline is over.

# Monthly Grant Amounts According to Countries

Students are paid grants to assist students with their additional expenses during their stay abroad. The grants are given merely as a contribution to their costs, it may not cover the full cost of the students' activities. The countries where student mobility activities can be









carried out are divided into 3 groups according to the level of living expenses and monthly learning and internship mobility grants are determined for these groups.

The groups of countries and the amounts of grants are given in the table below:

There is no additional travel support for students for learning and traineeship mobilities among the programme countries.

## Additional Grant Support for Student/New Graduate Mobility

Additional Grant Support may be provided to disadvantaged participants in addition to the grant they are entitled to. In order to be able to be paid with this grant, the disadvantaged participant is defined as an individual with limited economic and social opportunities and who fits into the following sub-categories.

- 1) Those who are subject to Law No. 2828 (Those who have a protection, care or shelter decision by the Ministry of Family and Social Services pursuant to Law No. 2828)
- 2) Students for whom protection, care or accommodation decision has been taken within the scope of Child Protection Law No. 5395.
- 3) Those who receive an orphan's pension
- 4) Children of Martyrs / Veterans
- 5) Those who are granted a needy pension for themselves or their families (the student, his/her parents or guardians have received financial support from municipalities, public institutions and organizations (Ministry, Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundations, General Directorate of Foundations, Kızılay, AFAD) proving that they have received financial support. At the time of their Erasmus application, the students have to submit the document related to this.)

  Credit and Hostels Institution scholarships and similar scholarships, other grants, aids and

scholarships in the nature of success scholarships, and one-time aids are not considered within the scope of mentioned financial aid.

The following amounts of Additional Grant Support can be provided upon their request and depending on the type of mobility to students who meet the above scope, on condition that they document their situation:

Mobility type	Additional Grant Support Amount
2-12 months student mobility	250 € per month

# **Green Travel Support**

If students prefer green travel, an additional one-time grant of 50 Euros and an individual support grant for travel days up to 4 days can be given. The aircraft is not covered by green travel. If the main vehicle, on which the majority of the distance between two points is covered, is a vehicle other than the aircraft, the green travel supplementary grant will be awarded.

## **Inclusion Support**

Erasmus+ Program encourages the participation of the people with special needs in the program. A person with special needs is a potential participant whose personal physical condition, mental state or health condition does not allow them to participate in the project/mobility activity unless there is additional financial support.

If the students with special needs are selected for the program, they will be provided with additional grant support. The additional grant rate cannot exceed the total Erasmus grant to be received. Detailed information about special needs support can be obtained from our Coordinatorship.
