#### Sarah's Year Abroad

As I sat staring out at California's coastline, I felt fortunate to have a sister who persuaded me to spend a year of my degree abroad. While most universities offer worldwide exchanges, where students swap places during their degree, the quality on offer varies.

A deciding factor for me in choosing the University of Edinburgh was that it offered more than 230 exchange places at overseas universities. However, I still found that deciding to spend a year abroad was something new to my friends. Yet, encouraged by my sister who told me I would love the coast, I applied to the University of California, Berkeley — never guessing that this would affect my decisions in the future.

In the beginning of the exchange, students should be aware that the time is limited and not to be wasted. Therefore, when I arrived, I started to work at a newspaper. I moved from an international house into a co-operative house where we managed the building. I met many people and learnt that believing in stereotypes about Americans would be inappropriate.

My grades at Berkeley didn't count towards my degree classification at Edinburgh. Still, I studied with a poet, attended seminars, and took a class that shaped my dissertation in Edinburgh. Whether I was learning about contemporary poets or reporting on the President's speech for the newspaper; my stay there taught me what I wanted to gain from my English literature degree.

To many, international exchanges seem like expensive, but I think students can save money during the program. Visas, health insurance and flights must be bought, yet a student will only be charged 25 to 50 per cent of their home university's annual fees. A student travelling abroad is entitled to a larger student loan, and grants are available for exchange students.

Taking part in an exchange may not appeal to all students. You must research the options, apply a year before and be aware of the grades required to qualify for a place on **one**. Even so, Edinburgh's international exchange officer, Helen Leitch, says: "If I had a pound for every time that students told me it was the best experience of their life, I would be a very wealthy woman indeed."
